**Vocabulary**

**answerable**- accountable; responsible; likely to be called upon

**lounge**- a place for sitting, waiting, or relaxing, especially a public space

**obligation**- a sense of duty or responsibility

**proportion**- the relation between things or parts with regard to size, number, or amount

**alliteration**- two or more words in close proximity begin with the same consonant sound

**assonance**- repetition of the same or similar vowel sounds in a group of words

**free verse**- poetry with no fixed rhyme scheme or meter

**narrative poem**- poem that tells a story
